This audition will be conducted by the producers and directors and will consist of a blind reading of excerpts the chosen play along with other auditioning actors. You do not need to prepare any audition material, nor is it necessary to book – just turn up on the day!

Please note:

- Some roles require accents you may be asked to read in a particular accent on the day
- This is an **adults only** (18+) production; there are no roles suitable for minors at this time
- We are willing to consider video or phone auditions if you cannot attend on the day

We are excited to see what you can bring to this fun and quirky play!

Rehearsals

Sundays 12:30pm – 2:30pm (commencing 19 March) AND Wednesdays 7pm – 9pm (commencing 22 March).

Tech week

Technical rehearsals will take place on the week commencing Monday 16 May. Dates and times are to be confirmed.

About The Show

Every drama group has experienced the horrors of what can go wrong on opening night, and the ladies of F.A.H.E.T.G. Dramatic Society are no different, with the possible exception that almost everything that could happen does! The scenery collapses, cues are missed, lines forgotten, and the sound effects take on a strange note at times, as the ladies present their ambitious evening's entertainment with the cunning whodunit, "Murder At Checkmate Manor".



Cast (4F, 1M)

Character ages and genders are indicative and not necessarily prescriptive. Some characters require accents as indicated.

GORDON (playing INSPECTOR O'REILLY)	M20-50 During the Murder Mystery show, GORDON struggles with stage fright resulting in missed cues, forgotten lines, misplaced blocking, questionable British accents and a myriad of mishaps.
FELICITY (playing- PAWN, a butler; COLONEL KING, Lady bishops Brother-in -law)	F20-50 Felicity clearly has things other than the play at hand on her mind. Felicity emanates a nonchalance interspersed with the petulant realisation that somehow the show must go on even if it means a less than enthusiastic performance.
AUDREY (playing LADY DOREEN BISHOP, a widow; VIOLET BISHOP, her spinster aunt; MRS KING, the COLONEL's wife; JOAN BISHOP, Lady Bishop's cousin)	F35-60+ Audrey is sensible, dutiful, dependable channels brave commitment as they push through their own nerves to keep the show going. They are the unsung glue that gives stability to an otherwise agenda driven and frenetic cast. Note: Violet Bishop speaks with a (bad) Yorkshire accent .
MRS REECE (playing CLARISSA ROOK, Lady Bishop's sister; REGINE, the French maid; PATRICIA BISHOP, Lady Bishop's niece; LETITIA BISHOP, her sister; MR GOODBODY, a solicitor)	F40+ Mrs Reece is the chairperson of the dramatic society, bossy, determined, exuberantly charismatic and dogged in her determination to ensure that 'her' audience will have no doubt that they are the self-professed star of the show. Note: Regine the French maid speaks with a (terrible) French accent.
THELMA (playing DAPHNE BISHOP, Lady Bishop's daughter; ROSE BISHOP, her spinster aunt)	F20 – 50 Thelma is the vice chairperson, second in command of the dramatic society, but dearly wanting to take charge. Thelma's strong sense of justice sees her attempt to stand up to Mrs Reece. Note: Rose Bishop speaks with a (worst of the lot) Yorkshire accent.
